Fees, Cancellations and Refunds Policy ISE

Fee Payment

Payment may be made in pounds on-line at our website payment service via: <http://www.ise.uk.com/quote> Please indicate your pro-forma invoice number if applicable.

Payment may be made in the school reception where cash, cheques and most debit and credit cards are accepted. All credit cards and any non-UK Debit cards will attract a transaction charge of 2.5% for VISA / Mastercard.

Payment may also be made in £ sterling (GBP) or € euros (EUR) by telegraphic transfer direct to the school's bank account quoting the following information:

Cancellation and Refunds

If notification of cancellation is received by ISE more than 14 days before the start of the course, ISE will retain the Registration Fee. If notification of cancellation is received less than 14 days before the start of the course, ISE will charge 50% of the fees. In the event of cancellation after the commencement or before the end of the course, no fees can be reimbursed.

No refund of fees can be made to any student who has been issued with a Short-Term Student Visitor Visa letter, Extended Student Visitor letter or CAS letter of invitation for immigration purposes unless an official letter of refusal, issued by either the Home Office or The British Embassy is produced. Students who have been issued with a Short-Term Student Visitor Visa letter, Extended Student Visitor letter or CAS letter of invitation who then decide not to apply to travel to the UK, or who travel to the UK and do not attend will not be entitled to any refund of fees in any circumstances. ISE maintains strict records of applicants and any non-travelling, non-arriving or non-attending students will be reported to the appropriate authorities.

Any refund of fees will be made via the same method of original payment, to the same originator of funds. ISE cannot refund fees to any third party in any circumstances.



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Any refund of fees will be sent net of bank or exchange rate charges as applied by HSBC.

ISE require that 100% of tuition fees be paid in advance for all private students before any visa invitation documentation is issued.

Further conditions

ISE only acts as an intermediary between its students and travel organisations on the one hand and host family on the other. Under no circumstances can it be held liable for any delay or accident during an excursion, activity or journey, nor can it be held liable for any accident that may happen during the student's stay.

ISE may also impose further specific attendance conditions for Tier 4 visa students or students aged 16 and 17. ISE reserves the right to terminate a course with immediate effect, without any refund, if these attendance conditions are not met.

ISE reserves the right not to allow on any course a student suffering from any mental or physical disability that has not been disclosed on the Registration Form. Please see the ISE Equal Opportunities Policy for further information.
